# **HLCCA 2024 Conference Frequently Asked Questions**

# **Conference Registration and General Information**

#### Q: What are the dates and the cost per member?

**A:** The dates are July 11–14. The cost is \$350 per member. Your registration fee includes admission to all Conference events; exclusive pottery pieces at the Banquet; mixer prizes; appetizers prior to the Friday auction, Saturday night banquet meal, and Sunday breakfast; and a tote bag.

# Q: What is the cancellation/refund policy?

**A:** For cancellations prior to May 1, the refund is 100% refund minus a \$50 cancellation fee; between May 1 and May 15 the refund is 50% minus the cancellation fee; and after May 15, there are no refunds. **Deadline for registration is May 15.** 

# Q: What hotel are we using for the Conference?

A: This year's Conference will be held at:

Crowne Plaza Albuquerque 1901 University Blvd NE Albuquerque, NM

You will need to make your own hotel reservation <u>AFTER</u> you have successfully registered for Conference. In order to get the Conference rate, you can call the hotel and identify yourself as an HLCCA 2024 Conference attendee or use the booking link. The phone number and the booking link will be provided after registration. We are hopeful the hotel can accommodate all attendees but cannot guarantee that.

#### Q: What is and is not included in the Conference room rate?

**A:** The rate is \$134/night plus taxes for either a double or a king for 1-2 people. \$144/night for a room with 3-4 people.

  - Complimentary long-term parking
  - Complimentary internet
  - On-site restaurants
  - Fitness center/pool
  - Pet friendly with deposit
  - Coffee maker/ironing board
  - o Mini refrigerator

The Conference hotel rate is available July 11—13 but on a limited basis for the days preceding Conference. You must request this when making your reservation in order to guarantee the HLCCA rate.

### Q: Can I bring a guest to Conference?

**A:** This event is for HLCCA members only. Certainly, a guest can travel with you, but they cannot attend any Conference events unless they are also a member and registered.

#### Q: What should I wear?

**A:** Dress for Conference is mostly casual wear. Most attendees wear shorts, jeans, t-shirts, etc. We do encourage everyone to dress up a little more for the banquet (khakis, a polo or button-up dress shirt, dress slacks or a dress for women) but it's not required.

#### Q: Can I volunteer to help?

**A:** YES!! We need all the volunteers we can get to help the Conference run as smoothly as possible. When Conference gets a little closer, we will email Conference attendees a link with the various volunteer responsibilities and times. Most of the time it's only an hour or two out of your weekend that you will need to volunteer, but it's a great way to meet new people and help the organization. Without the volunteers, we could not have a successful Conference.

#### Q: What should I bring to Conference?

**A:** Many members that are driving bring boxes and packing materials (bubble wrap, tape, tissue paper, etc.) for their anticipated purchases. Many bring extra supplies and are happy to share with other members. If you are shipping your purchases home, you may be able to find empty boxes around the hotel or purchase them at the shipper you choose to use.

# Q: Will I receive my registration packet in the mail before Conference?

**A: No**, you will receive everything you need when you arrive at the Conference. We will not send you anything in the mail. You can pick up your registration packet starting on Thursday at the HLCCA registration table at the hotel. Please look for the HLCCA table in the hotel lobby or near the ballrooms for your packet. There will be occasional email updates; we will email an agenda prior to the event to help attendees with planning.

# Q: What's included in the registration packet?

**A:** The packet will include the "Who, What, When Where, and Why" for the whole Conference weekend. Please read through the program booklet for all the exciting event details. The packet will also include exhibit ballots, auction information and bidding paddles, and your name tag. **You must wear your name tag to all HLCCA events.** 

# Q: What do I do after I arrive on Thursday and check in to the hotel?

**A:** Once you arrive, ask the hotel for the location of the HLCCA registration table. Sign-in and receive your Conference registration packet. Put on your name tag and start looking for other Conference attendees to get acquainted.

Be sure to bring your auction paddle so you can bid on those must-have items for your collection. Before the auction starts, there will be complimentary appetizers to enjoy during the "Eat and Peek."
